

Notice of Race – December 19, 2020

Committee Boat- TBD The Race Committee will likely conduct the race from the shoreline

Race Committee Chairperson – Cathy Eichmann (mobile # 401-440-4341)

All boats should monitor channel 71 for Start instructions and ongoing communication during the race

1. OA, Rules. The Amelia Island Sailing Club is the Organizing Authority for the race, which will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* (Rules, RRS).
2. Schedule of Race (All times GPS)
  - a. 1145 - Roll Call
  - b. 1156 – Six-minute warning
  - c. 1155 – Five-minute warning (engines off)
  - d. 1159 – One-minute warning
  - e. 1200 – RACE START

3. RACE COURSE (Approximately 11.1 nautical miles)

START LINE – Imaginary line between Amelia River Lighted Buoys Red 4 and Green 5

Mark 1 –Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Red 22 (port rounding)

Mark 2 – Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Green 31 (port rounding)

Mark 3 – Amelia River Lighted Buoy Red 2 (port rounding)

Mark 4 – Saint Marys Entrance Turning Basin Lighted Buoy C (port rounding)

Mark 5 – Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Green 29 (port rounding)

Mark 6 – Saint Marys Entrance Range Front Light and Passing Light - Spider (LEAVE TO STARBOARD)

FINISH LINE – Imaginary line between Amelia River Lighted Buoys Red 4 and Green 5 (LEAVE Red 4 to STARBOARD)

**Record your GPS time when the helms-person crosses the finish line.**

Report your time to Cathy Eichmann on VHF channel 71, or by mobile phone at 401-440-4341.

4. COURTESY BROADCAST: The Race Committee will use VHF Channel 71 to attempt to broadcast information on boats early over the line. Failure to receive or hear such radio transmission will not be grounds for redress. This is a change to RRS 60.1.
5. RETIREMENT: Any competitor retiring from the race shall immediately notify Race Committee on Channel 71.
6. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY: Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, “Decision to Race”. The organizing authority will not accept any liability, nor be liable, for any damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during or after the regatta.
