Valkyrie wins Amelia Island Sailing Club's pursuit race

The Amelia Island Sailing Club held its sixth race in the 2021 race season on Saturday. Skipper Justin Webb brought Valkyrie over the finish line of the 8-nautical-mile course in just over one hour and 35 minutes after starting.

Misty, skippered by Wilby Whitt, came in second, while Gary Sanders skippered Salty Sally to a third-place finish for the race.

It was a hot, sticky day, but the wind provided some relief from the heat and enabled the contenders to keep moving along the upwind and downwind legs of the course, at times fighting a fairly strong current.

The format for this race was a "pursuit race," and starting times for the contenders were staggered based on their handicap ratings, i.e., the slower the boat the earlier the start with the fastest boat in the fleet starting last.

For the crews on the first boats to cross the start line, this format resulted in keeping a look over their shoulders to see if the faster boats were gaining on them. There were several changes in the positions of the racers throughout the course because of the race format as well as the tactics chosen by the crews and their individual skills.
