All boats should monitor VHF channel 71 for START instructions and ongoing communication during the race.

- 1. OA, Rules. The Amelia Island Sailing Club is the Organizing Authority for the race, which will be governed by *The Racing Rules of Sailing* 2021-2024, Updated 2022 (Rules, RRS).
- 2. Schedule of Race (All times GPS)
  - a. 1015 Roll Call
  - b. 1024 Six-minute alert 5 short horn sound
  - c. 1025 Five-minute Warning Signal (engines off) 1 short horn sound
  - d. 1026 Four-minute Preparatory Signal 1 short horn sound
  - e. 1029 One-minute Signal 1 long horn sound
  - f. 1030 RACE START Signal– 1 short horn sound
- 3. RACE-COURSE (Approximately 9.2 nautical miles); Wind Forecast out of the East 10-12 mph, gusting to 20; High tide at the "Spider" at 1141.
- 4. START LINE Imaginary line between Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Red 24 and Green 25
  - Mark 1 Saint Marys Entrance Turning Basin Lighted Buoy "E" (port rounding)
  - Mark 2 Saint Marys Entrance Turning Basin Lighted Buoy "F" (port rounding)
  - Mark 3 Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Green 29 (port rounding)
  - Mark 4 Coast Guard Mooring Buoy SM (port rounding)
  - Mark 5 Saint Marys Entrance Turning Basin Lighted Buoy "C" (port rounding)
  - Mark 6 Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Red 24 (port rounding)
  - Mark 7 Saint Marys Entrance Range Front Light and Passing Light SPIDER (port rounding)
  - Mark 8 Cumberland Sound Lighted Buoy Green 25 (port rounding)

FINISH LINE - Imaginary line between Amelia River Lighted Buoy Red 4 and Green 5. Leave Green to port.

Record your GPS time when the bow of your boat crosses the finish line. A headsail set forward of the bow does not qualify as a finish. This is a change to align with the *Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024*. Whisker poles may be used, must be attached to the mast and their length cannot exceed the boat's LP measurement.

- COURTESY BROADCAST: The Race Committee will use VHF Channel 71 to attempt to broadcast information on boats early over the line. Failure to receive or hear such radio transmission will not be grounds for redress. This is a change to RRS 60.1.
- 6. RETIREMENT: Any competitor retiring from the race shall immediately notify Race Committee on Channel 71.
