

Coastal Cup 2019

Heading towards the summer break we had a couple of races that brought several member's boats out on the water. On the 27th of April, the second club race of 2019 had five boats compete and then on 18 May, nine of our club's boats participated in the annual Coastal Cup Race with the Golden Isles Sailing Club from St. Simon's Island.



The night before the Coastal Cup all participants attended the skipper's briefing at the Amelia Island Marina hosted by the Golden Isles Sailing Club.



The start was a great sight – 12 sailboats lining up and heading for the start line.



In addition to the race boats, Peter Kurtius was out keeping an eye on things from the fly-bridge of his Grand Banks.

Three boats from the Golden Isles Sailing Club rounded out the field of twelve competitors – four in the spinnaker class, eight in the non-spinnaker class. *Fin* skippered by Graeme Nichol was over the finish line first with an actual time of 5:34:40. Awards were given for first, second and third place based on corrected times after each boat's handicap was applied. Our club got first place in both classes of racers and took all three spots in the non-spinnaker class. Spinnaker class first place went to Wilby Whitt skipper of *Misty*, non-spinnaker first place went to Larry Murphy skipper of *Wayward Wind*, *Sea Esta* skippered by Glen Stettler came in second and good 'ol *Lucky Enough* skippered by yours truly got third place (ya gotta love that big handicap – largest one in the fleet!). And, the best overall corrected time went to Larry Murphy. Larry's name will go on the Coastal Cup perpetual trophy for 2019! Congratulations to the winners and I'm especially pleased with the large participation by our club - thanks. It was a great day out there! Hard to believe it's almost time for our "summer break" in July. No Scuttlebutt next month; so, keep an eye out in email for some possible events.



David Heine from the Golden Isles Sailing Club presented the awards after the race at the Morningstar Marina on St. Simon's Island. *Misty* skippered by Wilby Whitt came in first in the spinnaker class with a corrected time of 4:40:42.



Wayward Wind skippered by Larry Murphy came in first in the non-spinnaker class with a corrected time of 4:36:57. Larry also was the recipient of the perpetual trophy awarded each year for the best overall time.

Member Pictures Coming to AISC Web Site

A number of members have suggested that pictures of members be available on the web site. To that end the next step in the evolution of the web site is underway. I am currently looking in to adding individual pictures to each of the membership records in the database. This will be a strictly voluntary participation on the members part, that is they can choose to have a picture on the site or not.

Please recall that member data is password protected. As with the information currently available to members your picture will be available to members who log into the web site.

There are some differences in the types of pictures that will be input to the database. We currently have three types of memberships: individual, family and joint. Memberships are driven by email addresses so that individuals and family members have their own unique email address while the joint membership share an email address. For the pictures then, the individual and family members would probably have an individual picture while the joint membership could have a picture of a couple.

This effort is in its experimental stages and I hope to have it solidified next month. In the meantime if a few members would like to send me a .jpg file with your picture it will give me an opportunity to experiment with downloading, processing and adding pictures on the web site.
