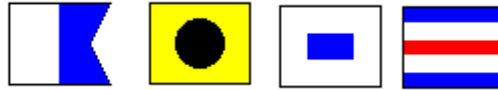

Club holds third race of the year

The Amelia Island Sailing Club's third race in 2022 was held on Saturday using a "pursuit race" format. Four boats competed, each starting at different times based on their handicap ratings. Misty, skippered by Wilby Whitt, was the last to start but managed to pass the other competitors and cross the finish line first, winning the race.

On Eagle's Wings, skippered by John Drake, came in second, and Gary Sanders skippered Salty Sally, coming in third. Rebecca's Reach, winner of this year's Coastal Cup held in May with the Golden

Isles Sailing Club, was fourth over the finish.

The wind and weather cooperated to make it a great day, with Misty finishing in under two hours after traversing the 8.1-nautical mile course in Cumberland Sound. Misty has a good lead on this year's Amelia Island Sailing Club races, taking first place in all three held thus far.

The Amelia Island Sailing Club usually holds races monthly throughout the year, including two ocean races with the Golden Isles Sailing Club in St. Simons.

Additionally, the club conducts monthly

water sampling along the Amelia River supporting the St. Marys Riverkeeper efforts with the Georgia Adopt-A-Stream volunteer water quality monitoring program. The club's social activities include trips to Crystal River to swim with the manatees and regular club meetings usually held the first Tuesday of each month at the Kraft Athletic Club on Buccaneer Trail.
