To Watch the Inshore Races:

Youth Sailing Regatta — youth sailors sail in the Matanzas Bay between the Castillo and Bridge of Lions.

- Saturday, March 18, 2023 12:00pm-4:00pm
 Sunday, March 19, 2023 10:30am-2:30pm
- You can watch from the Bridge of Lyons or the shoreline between the Castillo and the bridge of Lyons.
- Monday, March 20, 2023 Free Day * Who knows...Maybe the Dragon Boats will show up!

To Watch the Inshore Races:

Inshore Racing Series — sailors race their yachts in the Tolomoto River, North of the Vilano Bridge.

I wanted to thank everyone again for their support of the club during my tenure as Commodore. Peter is in full swing as the new Commodore and has already made a great starting plan for an active year of events.

As Rear Commodore, in addition to supporting Peter and Michael, I will be working to enhance our use of WildApricot, the online software that provides our membership management system and our website. The first task will be to streamline our membership "types".

We have three types of membership setup in our system; "Individual", "Family" and "Joint". These were set up in the past for various reasons but are no longer needed and just complicate communication. We will soon be converting everyone's membership to "Joint". For each standard \$100 membership you can have two separate (but linked) contact records in the database. This allows two separate logins to the website and provides separate emails for the two contacts allowing individualized communication. If you already have two contacts in the database, you will not notice any change. If you only have one contact record, you will receive an email asking for the name and email address of the second member. This second contact record is not mandatory so you can decline this option. However, it will help us when scheduling events.

The next project will be to enhance the website functionality as a communication tool.

Above I have reconstructed the checking account statements published in the AISC Scuttlebutt in 2022. In this smmary the cost of Club Events is easily viewed. Other club expenses are listed for better disclosue. Because of bulk purchases (table covers, plastic ware, etc.) some Landside purchases are spread over several events. Strict cost accounting is an unnecessary exercise. Miscellaneous expenses include state registration fees, the club post office box, and other incidental expenses. AISC is strong financially. However, I do recommend event tricket pricing be reviewed.

AISC CLUB RACING NORM WENTWORTH



What a beautiful day it was for the annual "Ice Bucket Challenge" Race was held on Saturday, January 28 with four boats racing. A fifth boat had planned on racing but last minute problems kept her out, and several other boats were undergoing annual maintenance or repairs and promised to be out for the next race. The 7.6 nautical mile race in Cumberland Sound started at 11:00 under clear skies, steady 12mph NE winds on an incoming tide. Good maneuvering at the start had Morning Glory pegging the line forcing Misty and Lola to dip and start behind her, followed by Salty Sally. The windward beat to the first mark saw a change of place with Misty first around the mark, followed very closely by Morning Glory and Lola. This "chase" held until midway down the third leg when Lola was able to catch slightly more wind and passed Morning Glory who attacked to defend her position but then had to fall off for the approach to mark 3, the "Spider". The rest of the race was wonderful fast sailing with Lola and Morning Glory trying to get past Misty for "line honors" at the finish, but Misty's normally fast speed allowed her to hold the lead and cross the line first. The finish was close on elapsed time, but after adjusting for the PHRF ratings, Lola (Jos Wolke and team) captured the "Ice Bucket Challenge" with a winning margin of only 9 seconds ahead of Morning Glory. A GREAT DAY OF RACING.

Lets Go Racing - AISC members own about 15 sailboats of which about 12 have raced at one point or another in the past. It would be wonderful to have 8-10 boats out for the AISC races this season. The start lines are long, being set between government channel markers, so there is no need for "crowding" at the start. As all of the boats are different, there may be some close racing as in this month's race, but the monthly races are really a wonderful opportunity to sail your boat as fast as you can and the PHRF handicap takes care of the rest at the finish. As the saying goes "On any given race day..." anyone has a chance to win, but most importantly enjoy your sailboat alongside other AISC member boats.

Race Committee Boats needed - ideally every race will be supported by a powerboat on the water hosting the Race Committee to start the race and take pictures. While you do not need to stay for the entire race, it is an opportunity to use your powerboat, watch the sailing event, and cruise Cumberland Sound alongside the racing sailboats.

The next race is on Saturday, February 18 which is a change from the original date of February 25 which is the date of the annual AISC Oyster Roast. Watch for the email announcement a couple of weeks before the race and please respond if you plan to race, would be available to crew on a sailboat, or you would like to serve as race committee boat. Do visit the <u>AISC Website</u> often to view the calendar of events and explore the various pages on the site - there is lots of interesting information.
