In 2023 we had fewer Club Events than in 2022. Expenses for the Oyster Roast and Thanksgiving Dinner were less but the Holiday Party expenses increased. With fewer events, payments received and expenses were less than in 2022. In 2023 the club holiday party contribution was \$4,440.99, \$585.67 more than the \$3,855.32 contribution in 2022. Holiday and event ticket pricing needs to be reviewed. The Club remains in good financial condition but inflation expense increases have reduced the year end Checking Account balance by \$2,594.08 in comparison to year end 2022.

"Misty" Wins the Ice Bucket Challenge Race

AISC held its first race of the 2024 racing season on Saturday, January 20. It was a gorgeous sailing day. The mid-40s cold temperature and variable northwest winds of 10-15 knots under clear sunny skies were suitable for this annual race - The Ice Bucket Challenge. The Club's perpetual "Ice Bucket Trophy" has been awarded to the winner of this race since 1985. Hearty congratulations to "Misty" for racing hard and fast by her owner

Wilby Whitt, helmsman Fred Eichmann and crew members Dave Ahlers and John Hodge to win this year's Ice Bucket Challenge Race.

Seven sailboats with 24 bundled-up sailors competed for the trophy on the 6 nautical mile course, with the start time of 1pm. The Race Committee Boat was under the command of Russ Ridley and his crew, including Tom Maguire who took some great <u>pictures</u>. There were some close finishes including Bill Kavanaugh on "Tiger Tale" taking line honors only 2 minutes ahead of "Misty." A short while later Gary Sanders brought "Salty Sally" to the finish only 1 minute ahead of Jos Wolke on "Lola". Rounding out the finishers were Norm Wentworth on "Morning Glory" and Jason and Colleen Gerke on "Juliana". A grounding of "Valkyrie" in the shallows of the west end of Cumberland Island resulted in her not finishing the race after receiving assistance from the Race Committee Boat. Fortunately, no injuries or damage. After applying PHRF Racing handicaps, the corrected finish order was "Misty" winning the race, then "Tiger Tale", "Salty Sally", "Lola", "Morning Glory" and "Juliana". The races and dates for the next several months are listed below. As a reminder, all boats should renew their PHRF Certificates for 2024 or obtain a new Certificate from First Coast Sailing Association. Applications are available from the FCSA website at sailjax.com. Also, registration is now open for the annual Saint Augustine Race Week (SARW), which consists of three ocean races for the larger boats on April 11-13. Currently there are 18 boats registered, including "Morning Glory" from AISC.


